Adult Immunization Status (AIS-E) -

This measure evaluates members ages 19 and older who are up to date on recommended routine vaccines for influenza, tetanus and diphtheria (Td) or tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis (Tdap), zoster, and pneumococcal.

Did You Know?

- Adult vaccination rates are extremely low.
- The majority of adults lack awareness regarding their vaccination requirements.
- The strongest indicator of whether patients receive vaccinations is a recommendation from their healthcare provider.
- Numerous vaccination opportunities are missed due to the routine failure of healthcare professionals to assess vaccination status.

- Utilize reminder systems, such as phone calls, text messages, or patient portals to prompt patients about upcoming or overdue vaccinations.
- Address concerns or misconceptions about vaccines through open communication and personalized discussions with patients.
